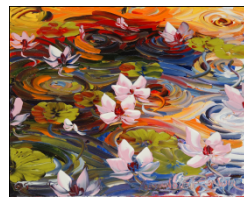

Boca Raton FL, September, 2010: An impressive collection of exquisite works by artists Pierre Henri Matisse, together with the celebrated Modern Master Alexandre Renoir will be on exhibit and available for acquisition at the venerable Wentworth Gallery in the Mall at Short Hills in Short Hills, New Jersey on Saturday, October 23rd, 2010. The exhibit is a rare opportunity to meet both Renoir and Matisse; with a scheduled special appearance by the famed artists for the public between the hours of 4:00pm - 7:00pm. This **once-in-a-lifetime experience** to have both Modern Masters in the same gallery at the same time has set the art world on fire...the two greatest names in Art together for the first time in an exhibition **not to be missed**.

Following in the footsteps of his famous step-grandfather, Henri Matisse, and his sculptor father, Jean Matisse, Pierre has carved his own niche in the art annals, creating his own unique and innovative body of work, yet still honoring his family traditions. While Pierre Henri Matisse is an internationally known artist, he is very proud to have garnered the moniker of 'The American Matisse, The Artist of Freedom and Love' a description which was first coined by art critics and the media. In educational circles he has been credited with starting a new art movement and 'ism' known as E-motion-alism.

Alexandre Renoir, great-grandson of French Impressionist Pierre-Auguste Renoir (1841-1919), grandson of Claude Renoir (1901-1969), and son of Paul Renoir (1925-2005) will make a special appearance alongside Monsuier Matisse. His works currently reside in quite important private collections throughout North America, Asia, Europe and the United Arab Emirates.

Born in Cagnes-Sur-Mer in the sunshine of the south of France in 1974 and more than half-a-century after his great-grandfather's death, Alexandre was the youngest of four boys

born to Paul & Leslie Renoir. Life in the Renoir household consisted of art and artists. As a young boy, Alexandre's parents recognized his extraordinary creativity and quickly encouraged the young, budding artist. Thus, the story of this great young artist was born...and continues. Alexandre Renoir's style is a mix of impressionism, old and new. He cites his famous great-grandfather and the French Impressionist Claude Monet as his strongest creative influences. An example of his work, perhaps one of his finest, is "Bouquet and Vase", Oil On Canvas (shown here) and on display for this exhibit. Complimenting is a piece entitled "Fall In Giverny" the artists' 2010 delightful mixed media on canvas.
